

**Resolution no. 53/IV/2017  
of the Senate of the Jagiellonian University  
of 26th April 2017**

**on changing the Regulations for first-cycle, second-cycle and Long-Cycle Magister Programmes of Study at the Jagiellonian University and on the publication of the unified version of the resolution no. 45/IV/2015 of the Senate of the Jagiellonian University of 29th April 2015 on the Regulations for first-cycle, second-cycle and Long-Cycle Magister Programmes of Study at the Jagiellonian University.**

Pursuant to Art. 62 (1) and Art.161 (4) of the Act of 27th July 2005 – Law on Higher Education (i.e. Journal of Laws of 2016, item 1842) the Senate of the Jagiellonian University resolves as follows:

§ 1

The annex to the resolution no. 45/IV/2015 of the Senate of the Jagiellonian University of 29th April 2015 on the Regulations for first-cycle, second-cycle and Long-Cycle Magister Programmes of Study at the Jagiellonian University is amended as follows:

1. In § 1 part 2, after item l), item m) shall be inserted which receives the following wording: *“course of study – course of academic studies comprising in particular completed years of studies, including leaves granted in the course of study and repetition of a year.”*
2. In § 3 part 5 is repealed;
3. § 4 part 6 receives the following wording: *“A student shall be obliged to declare a choice of subjects to be taken in a given year of studies and to declare at least 60 ECTS points for two semesters combined, except for the cases described in § 10 part 2 item 2) and § 11. A student’s declaration of subjects chosen shall be completed in the USOSweb system and submitted in a signed printout version to the appropriate office according to the deadline set by the faculty council. The faculty council may exempt a student from the obligation of submitting the declaration if it is not possible for the student to select subjects in a given year of studies.”*
4. In § 4 part 9 is repealed;
5. In § 6, parts 6-9 shall be inserted which receive the following wording:  
*“ 6. Exceptionally gifted students of secondary schools may, upon the dean’s consent, participate in the classes included in the programme of studies in the fields of study corresponding with their abilities, having received a positive recommendation from the school principal and, in the case of students under the age of 18, their parents’ or legal guardians’ consent.*  
*7. The students referred to in part 6 who are granted permission to participate in classes:*
  - 1) have the right to use the University facilities as well as the help of academic teachers and University administrative bodies;*
  - 2) shall respect the rules and regulations in force at the University;*

- 3) *in accordance with the following regulations, may obtain credits for classes which shall be documented by the University; the faculty council may establish an individual course of study and any additional principles of obtaining credits for classes;*
8. *Students under 18 shall be supervised by an academic teacher appointed by the dean.*
9. *If the students referred to in paragraph 6 are admitted to the studies at the University, upon the student's request, the dean in consultation with the person conducting the subject may agree to take into account the credit obtained for a given subject within the period of five years of obtaining the credit. § 11 part 3-5 shall be applied accordingly."*
6. § 7 part 1 receives the following wording: *"If the study programme includes a period of practical training or internship, the dean may consent to give credit for the practical training or internship if a student has had a documented experience which has accomplished the aims of the practical training or internship."*
7. § 12 part 3 receives the following wording: *"The person conducting the subject, in consultation with the dean, shall determine the dates of exams or deadlines for credits. Moreover, he or she may determine other dates of exams or deadlines for credits also outside the examination session not later than by the end of the summer re-sit examination session. The information concerning the dates of examinations or deadlines for credits shall be announced to students not later than one month before the first scheduled date of such an exam or deadline for credit."*
8. §12 part 4 receives the following wording: *As a rule, at least one exam date shall be scheduled for the main examination session and at least one for the re-sit examination session. In the case of subjects taking place in the winter semester, the final date of the exam or deadline for obtaining credit shall be scheduled before the end of the winter re-sit session, whereas in the case of subjects taking place in the summer semester - before the end of the summer re-sit session. In justified cases the dean may consent to not scheduling dates in the course of an examination session on condition that the date of the re-sit exam is scheduled not earlier than 14 days from the first date of the exam."*
9. In § 12 part 12 is repealed;
10. § 12 part 13 receives the following wording: *"The person conducting the subject, shall enter the results into the USOSweb system within 10 days of the date of the exam or the deadline specified for obtaining credit."*
11. § 12 part 14 receives the following wording: *"A student has the right to see his or her graded written assignment within 14 days of the date when the results were announced."*
12. § 14 part 4 receives the following wording: *"In justified cases, once in the course of study, the dean may consent to student's repeating again the same year or another year of study."*
13. § 14 part 5 receives the following wording: *"In justified cases, once in the course of study, the dean may consent to student's repeating a subject in the same academic year within the deadlines referred to in § 9 part 2, part 3 or 4, sentence 2."*

14. § 15 part 3 receives the following wording: *“An exam before a board shall be scheduled, in consultation with the student who has requested it, within 2 to 14 days of the date when the decision to hold such an exam was issued.”*
  
15. § 17 part 1 receives the following wording: *“A student writes his or her diploma dissertation under the supervision of an academic teacher who holds the following academic title or degree: doktor habilitowany. An academic teacher who holds the degree of doktor and is employed at the position of an adiunkt (adjunct professor) or starszy wykładowca (senior lecturer) may also be the supervisor of a diploma dissertation.”*
  
16. § 17 part 2 receives the following wording: *“The faculty council may define additional requirements concerning the supervision of diploma dissertations and may authorise a person who holds at least the degree of doktor but who does not meet the requirements referred to in part 1 to supervise a diploma dissertation.”*
  
17. In § 17 paragraphs 3 and 4 are repealed;
  
18. § 17 part 5 receives the following wording: *“In justified cases the dean may change the person who supervises a diploma dissertation “*
19. In § 17 part 7, § 18 part 3, § 19 part 1-2, § 21 part 1 word “academic tutor” is changed to “supervisor”.
20. § 18 part 1 receives the following wording: *”A student is obliged to submit the final electronic version of his or her diploma dissertation, which must be approved by his or her supervisor not later than by the end of September in the last academic year in the course of his or her studies . The submission of such a dissertation is a necessary requirement a student must meet to obtain credit for his or her diploma seminar or for another type of class aimed at the submission of a diploma dissertation.”*
  
21. § 18 part 2 receives the following wording: *”In the situation referred to in § 9 part 3, a student is obliged to submit the final electronic version of his or her diploma dissertation, which must be approved by his or her supervisor, not later than by the end of the winter re-sit examination session (the end of the winter semester) in the last academic year in the course of his or her. The submission of a dissertation is a necessary requirement a student must meet to obtain credit for his or her diploma seminar or for another type of class aimed at the submission of a diploma dissertation.”*
  
22. In § 18, after part 3, item 3a shall be inserted, which receives the following wording: *“The detailed requirements concerning the submission of diploma dissertations shall be established in a Rector’s resolution.”*
  
23. § 20 item b receives the following wording: *“his/her diploma dissertation has been checked with the help of an anti-plagiarism programme.”*
  
24. In § 27, after part 5, part 6 shall be inserted, which receives the following wording: *“Except for the case referred to in part 5, a student who transfers classes for which he*

*or she has obtained credit in another institution of higher education, including foreign institutions of higher education, is awarded such a number of ECTS points as is allocated for completing classes and practical training at the receiving institution.”*

25. § 30 part 4 receives the following wording: *“Details of the conditions and principles of transfer from another institution of higher education and of changes of field of study or specialisation within the Jagiellonian University are determined by the faculty council. § 27 part 4 apply as appropriate.”*

26. § 38 part 1 receives the following wording: *“A graduation diploma with a distinction shall be awarded to graduates who:*

- a) have completed their studies within the time period specified in § 18 ;*
- b) have not repeated any year in the course of their studies*
- c) have been awarded a very good grade on their final diploma examination;*
- d) have been awarded a very good grade on the diploma dissertation;*
- e) have obtained at least a grade of 4.5 in the overall weighted mean grade for their entire course of studies*
- f) have not been punished by the disciplinary board in the course of their studies”*

27. Section 38 part 2 receives the following wording: *“The condition referred to in part 1 item c) does not apply to the fields of study whose study programme does not include the compilation and submission of a diploma dissertation.” ;*

## § 2

The unified text of the regulations of study, including the changes introduced by the following resolution and by the resolution of the Jagiellonian University Senate no. 48/IV/2016 of 27th April 2016 on the change of regulations of study for first-cycle, second-cycle and long cycle study programmes at the Jagiellonian University constitutes an annex to the following resolution.

## § 3

The resolution comes into force on 1st October 2017.
